Our Town Library: Family Theater

A colorful time was had by all as PWPL's "Junior Aide Lock-In" had fifth through eighth graders painting canvases that will be part of the multi-media mural for the November performance of "Our Town Library: Family Theater." Nearly 30 canvases painted by nearly 30 keen artists will be used as set pieces demonstrating the rapid growth of the library from 1892 to the present. This mural is made possible with funds from the JP-Morgan Chase Regrant Program (administered by the Huntington Arts Council, Inc.) The grant was secured for the library by Elise May, director of the program. Creative Director Katie Lyons guided the Junior Aide Rembrandts.

On Sept. 22, there will be a meeting at the library for all interested in working together on Saturday mornings for six weeks of storytelling adventure leading to performances in November. The journey begins in 1892, when Port Washington was a town of 800 people, and the library started in the foyer of the Mitchell house. The journey continues with the growth of our town and how the library grew to meet our needs up to the present and on to the future.
